In addition, a petition would allow for three additional street lights to be installed at all costs paid by the city. Clyde collected the required signatures from his neighbors, and went a step further. He included a reference sheet in his petition to the city that indicated homeowners' suggested placement of lights. The city approved his petition and the lights were installed. Clyde saw a need and was willing to take ownership of what he wanted to see upgraded in his neighborhood. Clyde is a great neighbor and friend of Arlington Park.

Fall is an ideal time to care for your trees. Having trees trimmed or canopied now is a great way to get a jump on your spring clean-up. There are many tree-trimmers who advertise in the News & Views and we encourage Arlington members to reach out and support businesses who support Arlington Park.

A good neighbor will: • Be mindful of fallen leaves; • Keep your leaves raked or blown to the curb; • Check to be sure your street's sewers are cleared; • Check if your property has a drainage swale (sloped area of your lawn that directs rainwater), keep it clear of leaves; • Check on elderly neighbors and assist with yard work if you are able; • Avoid driving over leaf piles in streets; • Don't make leaf piles near mailboxes; • Carriers need full access to deliver mail.



Headwaters skating rink set to open November 21, but with COVID-19 related restrictions

FORT WAYNE. Ind. (WANE) The Headwaters Park outdoor ice skating rink is tentatively scheduled to open to the public on November 21, but the 18th season of operation will be unlike any previous one because of the coronavirus pandemic.

Assembly of the rink is set to begin this week and once it opens attendance will be limited to 50 percent capacity and masks or face coverings will be required on the premises and on the rink unless the current mask order is lifted by Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb.

Social distancing will also be required and advance reservations will be accepted. There will be hand sanitizers stationed at the park and other features to protect guests and staff. Restrooms and ice skates will be cleaned and sanitized on a regular basis. Guests may rent skates or bring their own. Extra precautions in the concession room will also be taken to provide safely for guests and staff.

The plan has been approved by the Allen County Department of Health.

"The pandemic continues

to have a strong hold on Indiana, but we felt it was important to continue the tradition of outdoor ice skating this winter, with extra precautions in mind," said Geoff Paddock,

Executive Director of the Headwaters Park Alliance.

Details of this season's sponsor, hours of operation, and pre registration details, will be announced at a later date.

Sometimes heavy rains can totally overwhelm Fort Wayne's storm sewer system. In autumn,

falling leaves can block storm drain inlets causing standing water and localized flooding even during smaller rain storms. You and your neighbors can protect your property and help ensure that emergency and other vehicles have access to your neighborhood by doing the following:

KEEP THE DRAINS CLEAR

1. Be a good neighbor and remove leaves and other debris from the gutters and storm sewer inlets near your home before it rains. This helps in several ways:

- Helps prevent street flooding during future rain storms
- Keeps your neighborhood looking tidy and well maintained

2. If you notice that your street is flooding, clear accumulated leaves and debris from storm sewer inlets to keep the water flowing.

3. Manage yard waste properly by keeping it out of the street and storm drain.

4. Never pour chemicals, grease, oil, paint or any other fluids down storm sewers.

Fort Wayne's Street Department employees will be picking up leaves and will clean leaves off the streets this fall. But the City also relies on your efforts as a good neighbor to reduce flooding and protect property in your neighborhood.


Fireworks show set for Nov. 10 in FW

September 10, 2020 - The City of Fort Wayne today announced the new date for this year's fireworks show at Indiana Michigan Power Center in downtown Fort Wayne. The special event will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 10, the eve of Veterans Day.

The City of Fort Wayne, Allen County Board of Commissioners, NAI Hanning & Bean, and the Three Rivers Festival will serve as sponsors for the fireworks display, which was originally planned for July 4.

At this time, and subject to the State of Indiana's Back on Track plan and guidance on social gatherings, groups of up 250 people would be allowed as of November 10 while following the CDC's social distancing guidelines and Indiana's mask requirement.

Due to the fireworks being visible from several locations in and around the downtown area, attendees are asked to utilize the various locations and spread out



to help ensure the safety of the public.

Leaders expressed the date was chosen to celebrate and recognize veterans and their service to our country and give residents something to look forward to as we've worked hard as a community to be safe and considerate of one another during the CO-VID-19 pandemic.

The City of Fort Wayne would like to thank NAI Hanning & Bean and Indiana Michigan Power (I&M) for partnering with the City on the use of Indiana Michigan Power Center. **Thanksgiving Coloring Contest** All colorings should be mailed or dropped off at the clubhouse no later than November 27.

Winners from three different age categories: 5 and under; ages 6-9 and 10-12 will be announced. Prize of \$10 for each age category.

Fire Department offers reminder to avoid open burning

As the leaves begin to fall from the trees, people look for ways to remove them. For those considering burning leaves, twigs or trash that have accumulated on their lawns, the Fort Wayne Fire Department reminds everyone to avoid open burning as a general rule.

FWFD Fire Marshal Jim Murua says, "No one is to kindle or maintain open burning consisting of a trash fire, leaf fire, refuse fire, or other open burning according to Fort Wayne City Code."

He explains that there are two exemptions allowed under certain conditions:

1. Bonfire celebrating school pep rallies are on exemption which requires obtaining a Burn Permit from FWFD at least 24 hours in advance of the permitted open burning. Call 427-1102 for more information or with questions.

2. Recreational camp fires for scouting or family cookout activities are allowed without a permit and a subject to the conditions listed below.

These exemptions must be subject to the following:

• A garden hose connected to a water supply, buckets, shovel, fire extinguisher or other approved fire-extinguishing equipment shall be readily available at the burn site.

• Only wood products shall be burned. No leaves, paper or trash.

• A fire shall be attended by a responsible party at all times until completely extinguished.



• A fire shall be located at least 25 feet away from any structure, fence or right of way.

• A fire shall not exceed an area three feet wide by two feet high.

• Anyone who recklessly, knowingly or intentionally kindles, or maintains any open burning consisting of a trash fire, leaf fire, bonfire, refuse fire, or other open burning that damages property of another person may be liable for criminal mischief.

• Any person who maintains burning of combustible materials out of doors or open burning not permitted shall be in violation and may be fined \$50. If the violator does not appear in response to a notice issued to them within a period of 30 calendar days from the date and time shown on the notice, the penalty shall be \$75. Repeat violators will be fined.

Please take the extra necessary to exercise safety at all times.








Santa Arrives at Arlington Park Dec. 12th
