Hey Neighbor!

It's the most wonderful time of the year (even with the loom-

ing pandemic)!

For Arlington residents, the winter holidays bring out joy, anticipation, celebrating traditions, and love of family and friends. Arlington's proud history of celebrating the holiday season is reflected in many years of activities for neighbors. With all the struggles of this year, Arlington continues to offer ways to celebrate the holidays. Let's look at the holidays – Arlington style!

Arlington hosts the annual Display of Lights contest. Residents have the opportunity to decorate the outside of their houses and properties each December. This year, ten homes will be selected to participate

in neighborhood voting for the Display of Lights.

To be considered for the 2020 Display of Lights, neighbors wishing to participate should have holiday lights turned on each evening of December 9th, 10th and 11th. Ten homes will be selected for voting.

During the week of December 15th through the 19th, Arlington families may pick up a ballot from the clubhouse and vote for their favorite light displays. Completed ballots must be returned to the clubhouse by December 19th. The winner will be announced on December 21st. Winners will receive a framed photograph of their decorated home. The grand winner receives a \$250 gift certificate sponsored by Tom Koeneman Century 21.

This is a fun activity for residents! Plan to pick up a ballot, turn on holiday music, and drive around the neighborhood while voting for your favorite light display.

The trolley ride is a yearly tradition for many Arlington families. Due to Covid19, the trolley ride has been cancelled for this year. The trolley ride began in 1993 as a horse and buggy carriage ride through Arlington. The mode of transportation quickly changed to a trolley in order to accommodate more people. Over the years, Arlington has hired gospel singers, carolers, and Girl Scout troops to sing at the clubhouse between rides. For a few years, there was even a magician to entertain riders between trolley rides. Neighbors have enjoyed cookies from

New Haven Bakery since 1985. In more recent years, Joe Trent has served as resident commentator on trolley rides. We look forward to the return of the trollev ride next year!

The first Arlington Children's party took place in 1982 with the completion of the clubhouse. By 1984, the party included a ballet performance, and Wolf and Dessauer's Santa. Paul Saalfield, of One Hour Photo, provided photographs of children with Santa. In the party's early years, Santa gathered boys and girls for a talk and an opportunity to ask Santa questions. One yearly asked question was, "How old are you?" Santa always replied that he was as old as the hills and the



## Headwaters rink to open but with COVID-19 related restrictions

FORT WAYNE, Ind. (WANE) The Headwaters Park outdoor ice skating rink is tentatively scheduled to open to the public on November 21, but the 18th season of operation will be unlike any previous one because of the coronavirus pandemic.

Assembly of the rink is set to begin this week and once it opens attendance will be limited to 50 percent capacity and masks or face coverings will be required on the premises and on the rink unless the current mask order is lifted by Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb.

Social distancing will also be required and advance reservations will be accepted. There will be hand sanitizers stationed at the park and other features to protect guests and staff. Restrooms and ice skates will be cleaned and sanitized on a regular basis. Guests may rent skates or bring their own. Extra precautions in the concession room will also be taken to provide safely for guests and staff.

The plan has been approved by the Allen County Department of Health.

## Where and How to Recycle or Dispose of Christmas Trees in Indiana in January 2021



In many urban and suburban areas, Christmas trees are collected from curbside during the first 2 weeks in January.

Allen County residents may drop off and recycle their live Christmas trees at various locations free of charge, starting Thursday, Dec. 26, 2020 to Saturday, Jan. 11, 2021.

Be sure to remove all remove all lights, wire, tinsel, ornaments, nails, stands, other NON-Organic decorative materials and other materials that are not part of the original tree. This includes tree stands also. Flocked trees are usually accepted, but not artificial trees. Large trees (larger than the standard 6 - 7 ft tree) may need to be cut in half to be acceptable by your garbage hauler. But scroll down this page for more specific information and local links.

What happens to the trees? In most cases, the trees are chipped and made into a mulch which is usually made available, free to city or county residents. Important: Never burn your Christmas tree in a fireplace or wood stove. Burning the tree may contribute to creosote buildup and could cause a chimney fire.

## **Cross-Country Skiing...**

Cross country skiing will be permitted on the Arlington Park Golf Course under the following conditions:

- 1. There must be at least six
- (6) inches of snow covering the entire course.
- 2. All skiers must remain on the designated trail marked out on the course.
- 3. If conditions are suitable for skiing, there will be a green flag posted at the start of the trail, located near the golf shop

## **Snowmobiling...Not Permitted**

## Indiana Snowmobile Laws

14-1-3.5-15 Operations Restrictions Sec. 15: A person shall not operate a snowmobile:

- 1. At a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper having due regard for conditions that exist.
- 2. While under the influence of an intoxicating liquor or unlawfully under the influence of a narcotic or other habit forming or dangerous depressant or stimulant drug.
- 3. During the hours from one-half (1/2) hour after sunset to one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise without displaying a lighted headlight and a lighted taillight.
- 4. In any nursey, planting area, or public lands posted or reasonably identified as an area of forest or plant reproduction and when growing stock may be damaged.
  - 5. On the frozen surface of

public waters within one hundred (100) feet of a fishing shanty or shelter except at a speed of five (5) miles per hour or less.

- 6. Unless equipped with a muffler in good working order and in constan operation to prevent excessive or unusual noise and annoying smoke.
- 7. Within one hundred (100) feet of a dwelling between 12 midnight and 6 a.m., except on his own property or property under his control or as an invited guest.
- 8. On any property without the consent of the landowner or tenant thereof.
- 9. While transporting thereon a bow unless unstrung, or a firearm unless unloaded and security encased or equipped with and made inoperative by a manufactured key locked trigger housing mechanism.
- 10. On or across a cemetery or



burial ground.

- 11. Within one hundred (100) feet of a slide, ski or skating area, except for the purpose of servicing the area.
- 12. On a railroad track or railroad right-of-way, except railroad personnel in performance of their duties.
- 13. On public property unless authorized to do so.

Be Safe this winter. Watch for others!

## **Arlington Board Member Election Procedures**

- Arlington Board of Directors candidates must be residents in good standing (Association dues must be current and paid in full. The candidate cannot have an unsatisfied judgment against them).
- · Candidates interested in running for Arlington Park Board of Directors positions must notify the clubhouse of their intent to run for office in writing.

The letter of notification must be postmarked no later than Dec. 31st.

· Ballots will consist of only candidates' names that meet the requirements of notifying the clubhouse in writing no later than Dec. 31st and are members in good standing of Arlington Park.

 Candidates wishing to have a short article in the "Arlington News and Views" introducing themselves to Arlington residents may submit a biography to the clubhouse before the 1st of January.

All candidates eligible for election and any submitted biography shall be published in "News and Views".

• Proxy Ballots will be available 30 days prior to the election at the clubhouse. Members may obtain a proxy ballot within that time at the clubhouse.

All completed proxy ballots must be received at the Arlington Park clubhouse by 1st class US Mail or by sealed envelope hand delivered to the Arlington Park clubhouse on or before the 3rd Tuesday in

February in order to be counted.

• Voting for positions on the Arlington Board of Directors starts at 7:00 a.m. and ends at 7:00 p.m. on the 3rd Tuesday in February.

Voting takes place at the Arlington Park Clubhouse. No votes will be accepted at the annual meeting.

• The qualifying ballots will be counted by the election committee on the 3rd Tuesday in February.

The committee will validate signatures and lot numbers as votes are tallied.

• The results will be announced by the election committee at the Arlington Park Annual Meeting, by signage at the entrances of the addition, and printed in the "News and Views".







## When to call Animal Control about wildlife

Fort Wayne Animal Care & Control responds to calls about wildlife when a wild animal is in a person's living space, injured or sick. Encountering wildlife in Fort Wayne is common and in many cases there is not much we can do as an agency. Here are some tips to know when to make the call:

Observe the animals: If you can't immediately tell the animal is sick or injured we ask that you observe the animal for 24 hours. There's no need to panic right away. If it does not move from the area it's in give us a call and an Animal Control Officer will come check on it.

If a wild animal is simply in your yard – that does not warrant an officer being dispatched. You can contact a nuisance wildlife company to assist you.

If the animal is in your home give us a call.

If the animal is under your

porch or deck you will need to call a nuisance wildlife company.

If the animal is in an out building – open doors and windows and let it leave on its own. If some time has passed trying this method and the animal does not leave – call us.

# Wild animals can pose serious, sometimes fatal health risks.

It's important to remember that you should NEVER handle wild animals. Wild animals can carry dangerous diseases like rabies. In Indiana the wild animals at the highest risk of carrying rabies are skunks, foxes, raccoons, coyotes and bats. Rabies is a viral disease that infects the brain and spinal cord. The disease can be spread through bites and when the saliva of an infected animal enters an open wound or the eyes. Even baby animals can be infected, so while they

might be cute, injured or need assistance NEVER HANDLE THEM.

#### Reporting an Injured Bird

Calls about injured birds are not uncommon, especially in the spring. Birds on the ground that appear to be struggling to fly are most likely a fledgling bird. These are baby birds that have fallen down from their nests and are commonly confused with injured or sick animals. These birds are actually learning to fly and don't have the wing strength to fly back to their nests. This is a natural part of their development. These birds will be jumping around flapping their wings for an extended period of time. There's no need to panic – chances are it's a baby bird growing up right before your eyes!

If you see a bird struggling to fly – observe it for 24 hours before calling FWACC.



## **Abandoned baby rabbits**

You found a rabbit's nest in your yard. What should you do?

First, there's no need to panic. Rabbits often build their nests out in plain view and it's not uncommon to come across one. If you do, simply cover the nest back up and the mother will return. DO NOT take the baby rabbits out of the nest. If your dog or cat found the nest you can cover it with a basket or box that allows the mother to get in, but not your nets.

Mother rabbits only feed their

young five minutes a day. They tend to them early in the morning and in the evening. If you find a nest but the mother isn't around, don't worry she will be back.

You can put a ring of flour around the nest and check back the next day to see if the mother has come and gone. This is a good way to tell if the rabbits are truly abandoned.









