

Neighborhood Leaf Pickup Schedule Listed

Leaves are beginning to change color and fall, so Fort Wayne Street Department crews are gearing up for leaf collection starting the morning of Oct. 29th.


Collections will occur two times in each of the city's more than 400 neighborhoods, with the last week of collection starting in December.

For curbside leaf pick-up residents should rake leaves to the curb or park strip in front of their home, but not into the street. Leaves should be in the park strip by 7 a.m. on Monday of the week the leaves are to be collected for your area. Other yard waste should not be mixed with the leaves.

Residents can access daily collection updates at cityoffortwayne.org/leaves. There they will find a neighborhood schedule updated daily, collection map and general leaf collection information. This daily update will soon and residents can call 427-2603 for daily updates.

You can also schedule a pick-up if you place your leaves in biodegradable bags by calling 311. The bags should be placed at the curb and will be collected within two business days of the call.

Don't put leaves in your trash or recycling cart. This is against state law, and burning leaves is a violation of city code and can result in a fine. Don't place leaves in or over storm drains. Parents should remind children to not play in leaf piles near the street.



Holiday Recycling

The following holiday items CAN and CANNOT be recycled in your recycle carts

PUT THESE ITEMS IN YOUR RECYCLE CART

- Non-metallic wrapping paper & gift bags (handles removed)
- Tissue paper
 Cardboard with clear plastic windows
- · Gift boxes and shoe boxes
- Aluminum foil & food trays (rinsed off)
- Greeting cards, envelopes, gift cards and tags
- Old calendars (coils removed)



DO NOT PUT THESE ITEMS IN YOUR RECYCLE CART

- · No foiled or metallic-coated wrapping paper or gift bags
- No ribbons, bows, beads, string, garland or tinsel
- No holiday decorations (lights, bells, ornaments etc.)
- No bubble wrap
- No plastics without numbers
- No batteries, electronics or Christmas trees

If your family decided to celebrate your holidays with a live Christmas Tree this year, you may be left with the question of "what now?" once the egg nog is all gone and presents have been unwrapped. How do you get rid of your tree?

Live Christmas trees will NOT be picked up with regular trash collection. Luckily, we are offering Live Christmas tree recycling this year at no cost to Allen County residents! Simply bring your live trees to one of the drop-off sites during the posted hours, leave them in the designated area, and we will take care of the rest.

Remember to remove all ornaments, tinsel, and plastic bags prior to drop off. Artificial trees are not accepted and should be donated or reused. Wreaths and garland are also not accepted - they often contain wires that could harm the recycling equipment. Chriostmas lights can be recycled at other locations. Click here to learn more.

This program is open from December 26th, 2021, to January 15th, 2022. After January 15th, trees are still accepted at the Bio-Solids, Lime and Yard Waste Facility, though fees will apply.

Sledding is at its best at Roanoke Curve or Rocket Park. This provides a wonderful opportunity for the family to join in old fashioned fun. Because of the limited packing and slippery conditions, we ask that you not drive, but walk to the sledding hill...just part of the fun!

Cross-Country Skiing...

Cross country skiing will be permitted on the Arlington Park Golf Course under the following conditions:

1. There must be at least six on the course.

- (6) inches of snow covering the entire course.
- 2. All skiers must remain on the designated trail marked out on the course
- 3. If conditions are suitable for skiing, there will be a green flag posted at the start of the trail, located near the golf shop

Snowmobiling...Not Permitted

Indiana Snowmobile Laws

14-1-3.5-15 Operations Restrictions Sec. 15: A person shall not operate a snowmobile:

- 1. At a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper having due regard for conditions that exist.
- 2. While under the influence of an intoxicating liquor or unlawfully under the influence of a narcotic or other habit forming or dangerous depressant or stimulant drug.
- 3. During the hours from one-half (1/2) hour after sunset to one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise without displaying a lighted headlight and a lighted taillight.
- 4. In any nursey, planting area, or public lands posted or reasonably identified as an area of forest or plant reproduction and when growing stock may be damaged.
 - 5. On the frozen surface of

public waters within one hundred (100) feet of a fishing shanty or shelter except at a speed of five (5) miles per hour or less.

- 6. Unless equipped with a muffler in good working order and in constan operation to prevent excessive or unusual noise and annoying smoke.
- 7. Within one hundred (100) feet of a dwelling between 12 midnight and 6 a.m., except on his own property or property under his control or as an invited guest.
- 8. On any property without the consent of the landowner or tenant thereof.
- 9. While transporting thereon a bow unless unstrung, or a firearm unless unloaded and security encased or equipped with and made inoperative by a manufactured key locked trigger housing mechanism.
 - 10. On or across a cemetery or



burial ground.

- 11. Within one hundred (100) feet of a slide, ski or skating area, except for the purpose of servicing the area.
- 12. On a railroad track or railroad right-of-way, except railroad personnel in performance of their duties.
- 13. On public property unless authorized to do so.
