It's the most wonderful time of the year (even with the looming pandemic)!

For Arlington residents, the winter holidays bring out joy, anticipation, celebrating traditions, and love of family and friends. Arlington's proud history of celebrating the holiday season is reflected in many years of activities for neighbors. With all the struggles of this year, Arlington continues to offer ways to celebrate the holidays. Let's look at the holidays – Arlington style!

Arlington hosts the annual Display of Lights contest. Residents have the opportunity to decorate the outside of their houses and properties each December. This year, ten homes will be selected to participate in neighborhood voting for the Display of Lights.

To be considered for the 2022 Display of Lights, neighbors wishing to participate should have holiday lights turned on each evening of December 6th, 7th and 8th. Ten homes will be selected for voting.

On December 9th Arlington families may pick up a ballot from the clubhouse and vote

for their favorite light displays. Completed ballots must be returned to the clubhouse by December 11th. The winner will be announced on December 11th. Winners will receive a framed photograph of their decorated home. The grand winner receives a Golf Membership.

This is a fun activity for residents! Plan to pick up a ballot, turn on holiday music, and drive around the neighborhood while voting for your favorite light display.

The trolley ride is a yearly tradition for many Arlington families. The trolley ride began in 1993 as a horse and buggy carriage ride through Arlington. The mode of transportation quickly changed to a trolley in order to accommodate more people. Over the years, Arlington has hired gospel singers, carolers, and Girl Scout troops to sing at the clubhouse between rides. For a few years, there was even a magician to entertain riders between trolley rides. Neighbors have enjoyed cookies from New Haven Bakery since 1985. In more recent years, Joe Trent has served

Arlington Board Member Election Procedures

- Arlington Board of Directors candidates must be residents in good standing (Association dues must be current and paid in full. The candidate cannot have an unsatisfied judgment against them).

- Candidates interested in running for Arlington Park Board of Directors positions must notify the clubhouse of their intent to run for office in writing.

The letter of notification must be postmarked no later than Dec. 31st.

- Ballots will consist of only candidates' names that meet the requirements of notifying the clubhouse in writing no later than Dec. 31st and are members in good standing of Arlington Park.

- Candidates wishing to have a short article in the "Arlington News and Views" introducing themselves to Arlington residents may submit a biography to the clubhouse before the 1st of January.

All candidates eligible for election and any submitted biography shall be published in "News and Views".

- Proxy Ballots will be available 30 days prior to the election at the clubhouse. Members may obtain a proxy ballot within that time at the clubhouse.

All completed proxy ballots must be received at the Arlington Park clubhouse by 1st class US Mail or by sealed envelope hand delivered to the Arlington Park clubhouse on or before the 3rd Tuesday in February in

order to be counted.

- Voting for positions on the Arlington Board of Directors starts at 7:00 a.m. and ends at 7:00 p.m. on the 3rd Tuesday in February.

Voting takes place at the Arlington Park Clubhouse. No votes will be accepted at the annual meeting.

- The qualifying ballots will be counted by the election committee on the 3rd Tuesday in February.

The committee will validate signatures and lot numbers as votes are tallied.

- The results will be announced by the election committee at the Arlington Park Annual Meeting, by signage at the entrances of the addition, and printed in the "News and Views".

Arlington Park Association Board of Directors November 7, 2022 • Meeting

In Attendance: President Lynda Gevers, Vice-President Bruce Westendorf (local and via proxy), Treasurer Harlan Altena, Secretary Kyle Lehman, Alayna Hackert (via zoom), Alex Richardson. Guests Kim Bowman, Zach Zimmerman and Matthew Steury.

The meeting was called to order by Lynda Gevers, President, at 6 p.m.

Lynda Gevers and Harlan Altena entertained a question and answer period regarding the current operations budget for 2023. Matt had concerns regarding the expense of the golf course over income. Much of the golf course equipment is shared for maintenance of the common grounds. The golf course is fundamental in maintaining property values in the community as well.

Kim discussed her qualifications and experience regarding her role on the Architectural Committee, the challenges the committee faces, and positive impacts made.

Zach discussed security issues. These included staffing levels, wages, along with security con-

cerns the association faces on a daily basis.

Motion to approve October Board Minutes made, seconded and approved.

Flooring choices for the clubhouse discussed.

Pool fence screening: Not a budgeted item, various options were discussed, and the topic was tabled.

Social events and calendar for 2023 were discussed. Three general items of focus where the need for more volunteers, recouping monies with different events and increasing promotion of the events themselves.

Finance Review: Current dues collected are at 98%, being the total amount of \$774,914.50. Past due 13 members to include: (2) in probate, (1) payment plan and (10) delinquent.

Motion to adjourn, seconded and passed at 7:20 p.m. Next scheduled meeting will be Jan. 9, 2023.

2022 Leaf Pickup Program Dec. 5-9

The Street Department crews are picking up leaves in the SOUTH areas of the City.

On Monday, Oct. 31st:

To help make leaf pick-up most effective for your neighborhood, please keep the following in mind:

- Rake leaves to the park strip by 7 a.m. on the first day of the week when crews will be in your area.

- Don't put leaves in your trash or recycling cart. This is against State of Indiana law.

- Don't burn leaves. It's a violation of City Code and can result in a fine.

- Don't place leaves in the street.

- Don't place leaves in storm drains.

WANT TO SCHEDULE YOUR PICK-UP? YOU CAN!

- Just place your leaves in brown paper biodegradable leaf bags, set them at the curb and call 311 to schedule a pick-up.

- The leaf bags will be collected within two business days of your call to 311.

- Weather conditions or the volume of leaves in a particular area may cause the planned schedule to change.

- This list of pick-up locations will be updated daily by 3 p.m.



It is hard to pinpoint any specific circumstance that would definitely trigger a burglary, but one factor seems to stand out. The burglar has to have a way of knowing you are not home at that time. It might be that he is parked nearby as you leave or he could be just driving by about the time you pull out of your driveway.

Do you watch for strangers as you leave your house? Do you leave lights on or the radio playing when you are away? Following these tips will not guarantee that your house will not be burglarized, but these actions will reduce your odds of becoming a victim of burglary. Not displaying newly purchased household goods by breaking down boxes and placing them in a black garbage bag will hide what you possess now.

Ohhhhh!!!! the weather outside is frightful....just be glad you aren't listening to me sing that while I write it.

By the time you read this, we will be in the thick of the holiday season complete with egg nog, football parties, warm fires, egg nog, holiday traditions, school breaks and finally, egg nog.

(Did you know that experts would have it that the "nog" of eggnog comes from the word "noggin." A noggins was a small, wooden, carved mug. It was used to serve drinks at table in taverns (while drnks beside the fire were served in tankards).

It is thought that eggnog started out as a miture of Spanish "Sherry" and milk.

the English called this concoction "Dry sack posset." It

is very easy to see how an egg drink in a noggin could become eggnog.

The true story might be a mixture of the two and eggnog was originally called "egg and grog in a noggin." This was a term that required shortening if ever there was one.

Rich Eggnog! - Recipie 1

6 Large Eggs
3/4 c Sugar
1 1/2 c Brandy
1/2 c Rum
4 c Milk
4 c Cream
1/2 c Icing sugar
Nutmeg to sprinkle

Separate the yolks form the whites of the eggs. Beat the yolks slowly while simultaneously adding the sugar; do this until the mixture is pale adn golden. Now slowly add

in the brandy and rum, then beat in the milk and half the cream.

Set aside until just before serving, then whisk the egg whites until stiff adn fold them into the eggnog mixture. Whip the remaining cream and icing sugar until thick. Top each glass of eggnog with whipped cream and shake of nutmeg. this yields eight servings.



Indiana Snowmobile Laws

14-1-3.5-15 Operations Restrictions Sec. 15: A person shall not operate a snowmobile:

1. At a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper having due regard for conditions that exist.

2. While under the influence of an intoxicating liquor or unlawfully under the influence of a narcotic or other habit forming or dangerous depressant or stimulant drug.

3. During the hours from one-half (1/2) hour after sunset to one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise without displaying a lighted headlight and a lighted taillight.

4. In any nursery, planting area, or public lands posted or reasonably identified as an area of forest or plant reproduction and when growing stock may be damaged.

5. On the frozen surface of

public waters within one hundred (100) feet of a fishing shanty or shelter except at a speed of five (5) miles per hour or less.


6. Unless equipped with a muffler in good working order and in constant operation to prevent excessive or unusual noise and annoying smoke.

7. Within one hundred (100) feet of a dwelling between 12 midnight and 6 a.m., except on his own property or property under his control or as an invited guest.

8. On any property without the consent of the landowner or tenant thereof.

9. While transporting thereon a bow unless unstrung, or a firearm unless unloaded and security encased or equipped with and made inoperative by a manufactured key locked trigger housing mechanism.

10. On or across a cemetery or



burial ground.

11. Within one hundred (100) feet of a slide, ski or skating area, except for the purpose of servicing the area.

12. On a railroad track or railroad right-of-way, except railroad personnel in performance of their duties.

13. On public property unless authorized to do so.
