Guidelines for Roll-off containers and trucks

Neighborhood Cleanup Program Guidelines for Roll-Off Containers and Trucks. Materials that cannot be put into the container/truck include:

Anti-freeze Appliance with Freon Asphalt Auto Fluids Auto Parts Electronics Closed Containers Compressed Gas Radioactive Materials Chemicals Fire Extinguishers Fluorescent Bulbs Freon Refrigerant

Hazardous Waste Oil Based Paint Items Containing Mercury Lead Acid Batteries Special Waste Tires Used Oil Concrete Liquids Explosives Pesticides Herbicides Fertilizers

***Latex paint cans need tho be dried out before placing in the container. We cannot accept paint in a liquid form because it may leak out onto the ground or street.

Cleanups are from 8 a.m. to noon. Containers will be delivered by 8 a.m. and picked up between noon and 2 p.m. on the same day.

Do Not Overfill the container. Debris must not hang over the sides or stick up higher than the sides of the container, and the door must be able to close.

The neighborhood is responsible for the container. If it is overfilled, the neighborhood will be responsible for leveling off the container prior to pickup. If unacceptable items are placed in the container, the neighborhood is responsible for removal and disposal of the

No Rain Date for Containers/trucks. We will not be able to pick up containers and deliver them on another day if it is raining. If there is thunder and lightning, DO NOT, under any circumstances, try to do your cleanup.

Help keep storm sewers flowing!

ITEMS THAT SHOULD NOT BE IN SEWERS:

Catch basins and sewer inlets are for rainwater and melting snow only. Crews from the City of Fort Wayne's Water Pollution Control Maintenance Department, the department responsible for cleaning catch basins and storm sewer inlets, recently pulled a number of unusual items out of some City sewers including: boots, cellular telephones, VCRs, realtor signs, buckets and file cabinet drawers.

These items should NOT be put into storm sewer inlets.

The only thing that should ever go into a storm sewer is rainwater or melting snow.

NEVER PUT ANY OF THESE ITEMS INTO A STORM SEWER INLET:

Automobile fluids like oil or anti-freeze, leaves, sand or topsoil, grass clippings or other yard wastes, scrap lumber or any chemicals.

Clogged catch basins and inlets can cause many problems including odors, street flooding, even injury to maintenance employees.

In addition, children should NEVER play in or around storm sewer inlets or manholes. For storm or sanitary sewer questions or emergencies, please call 311.

Dumping Dead Tree Limbs

Dumping dead tree limbs, leaves and yard waste in the commons area also is prohibited and carries a \$1,000 fine. To properly dispose of leaves and waste you can bag them in a plastic bag not weighing moe than 60 pounds.

For tree limbs they need to be not longer than 4 feet and weigh no mre than 60 pounds and can be bundled with duct tape, rope or any means you have. Please call 747-4117 48 hours before garbage pickup.

City's Scheduled Recycling Pick Up

Many people seem to be confused in recent weeks about which week is the City's scheduled recycling pick-up. And on windy days like today, with full bins due to missed pick-ups and the resulting confusion about when recycling will be collected (today is NOT a scheduled city pick-up day for recycling), bins blow over and loose, lightweight items go sailing all over the neighborhood.





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
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
